Good shoes for walking

Sturdy trainers are fine. Bring shoes that you have already worn for a while.

Aim for comfort for the daytime

Shorts are okay for some trips, but are not appropriate for visiting churches, stately homes, museums, etc.

• Sunscreen and Sunglasses, when needed

Lightweight material that folds up, small and goes over anything you might be wearing. Mid-thigh length and hood are recommended.

Alarm Clock

Additional Tips:

Include a few plastic bags for dirty or damp clothes

Ensure that the last items you pack are the first things you will need when you arrive at your destination.

Do not become a target for thieves by wearing conspicuous clothing and expensive jewelry. Wash cloths and face towels may not be provided at some hotels, so bring your own from home.

U.S. Department of State Worldwide Travel Alert

The U.S. Department of State has issued a Worldwide Travel Alert

The State Department advises that U.S. Citizens should exercise vigilance when in public places or using transportation.

Please be aware of their immediate surroundings, and avoid large crowds or crowded places.

Since the alert is not location or event specific and State Department representatives indicated that there was no specific threat against U.S. Citizens. The alert is guidance for U.S. Citizens to be more cognizant of their surroundings due to recent events.

These suggested actions are the same common-sense measures recommended to all guests when travelling.

The safety and security of guests is the highest priority, therefore Security Departments, staffed with former Military, Intelligence and Law Enforcement Professionals, maintains close contact with Governmental Authorities, Local Law Enforcement Agencies and Private Sources for security assessments, information, and continues to monitor these alerts Worldwide.
